

## CSS MAX-WIDTH PROPERTY

- ◆ In CSS, the **max-width** property defines the maximum width of an html element like <h1>, <h2>, <p> tag etc.
- ◆ The estimation of the maximum width property can be in a number, length and percentage.

### Example:

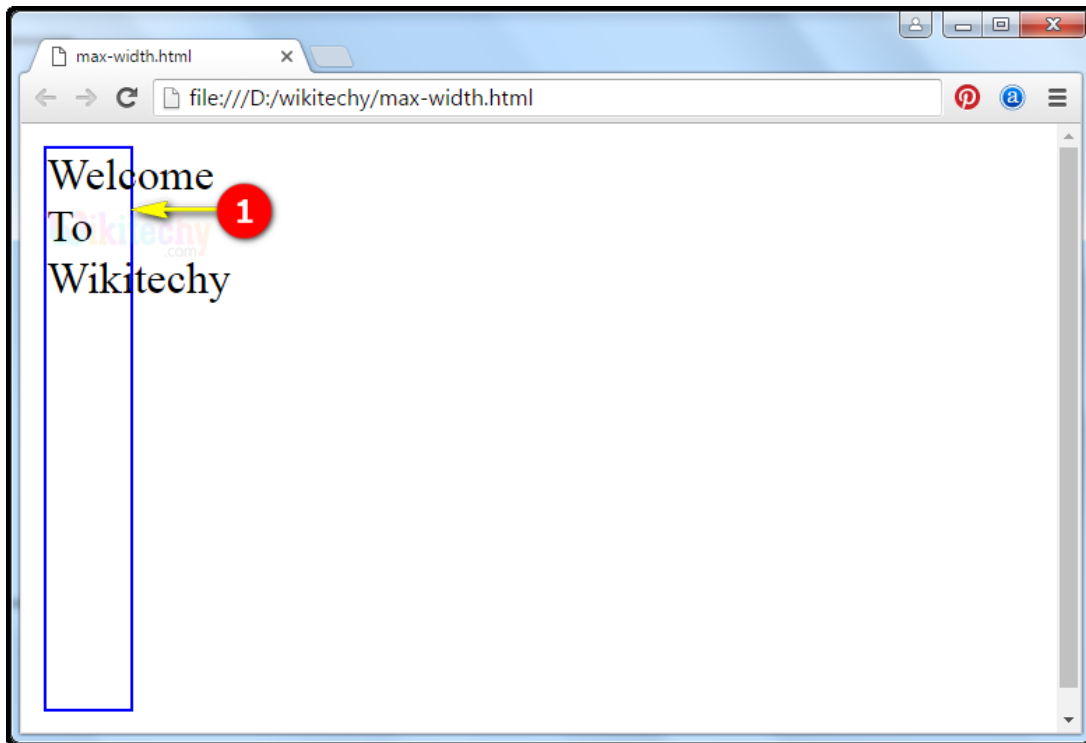

- 1** In CSS, **max-width** property is used to allocate a maximum width for an element. Here we had specified the maximum width of a paragraph tag (p element) as 30 pixels.
- 2** Similarly, **height** property defines the height of an element. Here we had specified the maximum height for the paragraph text as 200pixels.

- 3** **Border property** is used to create a border around an element. Border values **1px solid blue** defines the border strength, style and color respectively.

Output:



- 1** Here the paragraph text “**welcome to wikitechy**” have maximum width of 20 pixels and have blue color border around it which is also in 20 pixel width as displayed in the browser window.
