

## <img> - IMAGE TAG IN HTML

- The HTML <img> tag represents an image in the html document.
- There are two required attributes in <img> tag : src and alt.
- The <img> tag belongs to **Flow content, phrasing content, embedded content, palpable content**.
- The <img> tag supports **Global attribute and Event attribute**.

### Syntax for <img> tag in HTML

### Differences between HTML 4.01 and HTML5 for <img> tag:

#### HTML 4.01

- align, border, hspace and vspace attributes are supported.

#### HTML 5

- align, border, hspace, and vspace attributes are not supported in HTML5.


## Code Explanation for <img> tag in HTML

1. <img> used to display an image into the document.
2. src attribute used to define the location of the source image.
3. alt attribute is used to set alternate text for the image in case the image does not displayed the alternate text will be shown.

### Attributes:

Attribute	Value	HTML 4	HTML 5	Description
<b>charset</b>	char_encoding	Yes	No	Specifies the character encoding of the linked document
<b>align</b>	top bottom middle left right	Yes	No	Specifies the alignment of an image according to surrounding elements
<b>alt</b>	text	Yes	Yes	Specifies an alternate text for an image
<b>border</b>	pixels	Yes	No	Specifies the width of the border around an image



<b>crossorigin</b>	anonymous use- credentials	No	Yes	Allow images from third-party sites that allow cross-origin access to be used with canvas
<b>height</b>	pixels	Yes	Yes	Specifies the height of an image
<b>hspace</b>	pixels	Yes	No	Specifies the whitespace on left and right side of an image
<b>ismap</b>	ismap	Yes	Yes	Specifies an image as a server-side image-map
<b>longdesc</b>	URL	Yes	Yes	Specifies a URL to a detailed description of an image
<b>src</b>	URL	Yes	Yes	Specifies the URL of an image
<b>usemap</b>	#mapname	Yes	Yes	Specifies an image as a client-side image-map
<b>vspace</b>	pixels	Yes	No	Specifies the whitespace on top and bottom of an image
<b>width</b>	pixels	Yes	Yes	Specifies the width of an image
